Oxford Art Online

Provides biographies, bibliographies and links to images of thousands of artists by providing access to the entire text of 'The Dictionary of Art', ed. Jane Turner (1996, 34 vols.) and 'The Oxford Companion to Western Art', ed. Hugh Brigstocke (2001) online (subscription required). Hardcopies of these texts can be viewed at most good art reference libraries including major university libraries throughout the UK.

Searching for images

Provides information on over 8,000 artists. You can search for works by the name of an artist or by the title of the work. The website also provides links to public museums and galleries which hold works by the artist and to other web articles about them. It also provides a list of books available on each artist.

You can search their database by theme (e.g. 'Victorian society'), painting title or artist.
